GUIDANCE TO COMPLETING THE CASE STUDY TEMPLATE

A case study gives a brief overview of the work achieved through your pilot **project World Heritage Youth Ambassadors**, rather than the overall activity of your organisation.

We want to hear success stories about your young people you feel have particularly benefited from the program – we want to hear the stories you think are important to share. We don't mind what the benefit is – it could be increased confidence, achievement in qualification, contribution to community, small, or large, but we want to hear about the impact you have had on the young person themselves and how they feel about it. Please do make some reference to changes in your organisation if appropriate, but it's the young people we want to hear about. We are happy to receive as many project case studies as you feel appropriate, but only require one.

Points to consider when writing a case study for your project include

- The story has good quality image/s
- Clear positive impact on a young person
- Significant stats/data/figures stated in the story Numbers can really help to back up the story and demonstrate impact (BUT we don't want to hear just about numbers impact can come from 10 hours as well as 100!).

DATA PROTECTION

Prior to submission please ensure you have shared and agreed a draft of the text with any organisation or individual that features in the case study and have obtained the necessary permissions to use photographs for publicity purposes. Please ensure they sign this form!
